1 EXPANDING EMERGENCY SHELTER

In addition to emergency shelter beds in our congregate shelters, the CoC is providing temporary shelter options to ensure all those experiencing unsheltered homelessness have a safe place to quarantine during the pandemic.

2 PLANNING HOSPITAL DISCHARGES

Partnering with the Rappahannock Health District, Medical Reserve Corps, and area hospitals, the CoC is providing alternate spaces for isolation for those unable to safely isolate at home. This partnership will help reduce the strain on hospitals and slow the spread of the disease in our entire community.

3 READINGYING PREVENTION

In preparation for the expected increase in service requests due to the economic fallout of this pandemic, the CoC is coordinating community prevention programs between Loisann's Hope House, Rappahannock United Way, and Central Virginia Housing Coalition to identify solutions to assist those in need in our community and stretch funding.

4 SECURING PERMANENT HOUSUNG

The CoC remains committed to helping our neighbors experiencing homelessness find safe, stable housing. The CoC is working to identify permanent housing options for those served in our additional emergency shelter locations to ensure that they do not return to homelessness after the pandemic.
